THEY ARE REQUIRED TO HOLD A PH.D. (OR EQUIVALENT) IN CHEMISTRY, PHYSICS, MATHEMATICS, ECONOMICS, COMPUTER SCIENCE, NEUROSCIENCE, OR COMPUTATIONAL AND EVOLUTIONARY MOLECULAR BIOLOGY OR IN A RELATED INTERDISCIPLINARY FIELD. THEY MUST BE MEMBERS OF THE REGULAR FACULTY OF A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY IN THE UNITED STATES OR CANADA.

AMENDED AND RESTATED CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF

ALFRED P. SLOAN FOUNDATION

(A Delaware Non-Profit, Non-Stock Corporation)

ALFRED P. SLOAN FOUNDATION (the "Corporation"), organized and existing pursuant to the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware ("GCL"), does hereby certify as follows:

I. The name of the corporation is Alfred P. Sloan Foundation. The Corporation was originally incorporated under the name "Sloan Foundation, Inc." The date of filing of the Corporation's original Certificate of Incorporation with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware is August 2, 1934. A Certificate of Amendment of the Corporation's Certificate of Incorporation changing the Corporation's name from "Sloan Foundation, Inc." to "Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, Inc." was filed with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware on July 8, 1936. A Certificate of Amendment of the Corporation's Certificate of Incorporation changing the Corporation's name from "Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, Inc." to "Alfred P. Sloan Foundation" was filed with the Secretary of State of Delaware on October 6, 1958. Certificates of Amendment of the Corporation were filed with the Secretary of State of the State of Delaware on December 2, 1970 and February 8, 1988.

II. This amended and restated Certificate of Incorporation was duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Corporation in accordance with Sections 245 and 242 of the GCL.

III. This amended and restated Certificate of Incorporation restates the Certificate of Incorporation, as amended, to read in its entirety as follows:

FIRST - The name of this corporation is Alfred P. Sloan Foundation.

SECOND - The registered office of the corporation in the State of Delaware is to be located at 2711 Centerville Road, Suite 400, Wilmington, DE 19808 in the County of New Castle, and the name of its registered agent at such address is Corporation Service Company.

THIRD - The nature of the business of the corporation and the objects and purposes proposed to be transacted, promoted or carried on by it are as follows:

1 - To be conducted and operated not for profit but exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes, so that no part of its net earnings shall inure to the private benefit of any individual.

2 - Without limit as to the amount going to any one recipient or, in the aggregate, to all recipients, to make donations, gifts, contributions and loans, financial or otherwise, out of the annual net income and/or assets of the corporation, to or for the use of any of the following: the United States, any State, Territory, or any political subdivision thereof, or the District of Columbia, for exclusively public purposes and as hereinafter limited; any and all churches (without distinction as to denomination), Sunday Schools, missions and religious organizations of every kind and nature; community chests, funds, relief societies, old peoples homes, poorhouses, poorfarms, orphan asylums, eleemosynary institutions generally and charities of every kind and nature; laboratories, foundations, hospitals, expeditions and scientific organizations of every kind and nature; schools, colleges (whether sectarian or not), universities (whether State or not), incorporated boards of education, zoological gardens, art galleries, museums, musical organizations, associations, societies and concerts, opera companies, memorial associations, and educational institutions of every kind and nature; libraries and literary institutions of every kind, and nature, and generally any and all corporations, associations, joint ventures, partnerships, firms, joint stock companies, trusts, syndicates, organizations, institutions, foundations, individuals and projects, provided, however, that any and all donations, gifts, contributions and loans made pursuant to this paragraph "2" shall be exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals; and, provided, further, that any and all donations, gifts, contributions and loans made pursuant to this paragraph "2" shall not inure to the private benefit of any individual. No such donation, gift, contribution or loan shall be made to any organization, a substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

3 - To undertake, promote, develop and carry on religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational projects, plans and objects of every kind, nature and description and in any manner whatsoever; provided that the corporation shall not engage in carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including by the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

4 - To accept by gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, property of every kind and description without limit as to amount.

5 - To purchase, acquire, hold, invest, reinvest, use, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of the principal and income of funds and property of every kind and description, and, in particular, lands, money, buildings, mortgages, shares, stocks, debentures, securities, concessions, policies, notes, book debts, claims and any interest in any property which may be necessary or convenient for the use and maintenance of the corporation.

6 - To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind for any of the purposes herein set forth, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association or corporation of any and all States, Districts or Territories in or Colonies of the United States; or in any and all foreign countries, subject always to the laws of such State, District, Territory, Colony or country; to have one or more offices to carry on all or any of the operations and to exercise any of the powers of this corporation.

7 - To do all and everything necessary, suitable and proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any of the objects or the furtherance of any of the powers hereinbefore set forth, either alone or in association with other corporations, firms or individuals, and to do every other act or acts, thing or things incidental or appurtenant to or growing out of or connected with the aforesaid objects or purposes or any part or parts thereof, provided the same be not inconsistent with the laws under which this corporation is organized.

8 - The foregoing clauses shall be construed as both objects and powers, and the foregoing enumeration of specific objects and powers shall not limit or restrict in any manner the objects and powers of this corporation; the objects and powers specified in this Certificate shall, except where expressly limited, be in no wise limited or restricted by inference from the terms in any other clause in any other part of this Certificate, but the objects and powers specified in each of the clauses of this Certificate shall be regarded as independent and separate objects and powers of this corporation.

9 - Notwithstanding any provision of the foregoing clauses, the corporation

(a) shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws;

 (b) shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws; (c) shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(c)
 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any
 subsequent Federal tax laws;

(d) shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws;

 (e) shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.

FOURTH - The corporation shall have no capital stock.

FIFTH - The conditions governing membership, if any, shall be set forth in the by-laws of the corporation.

SIXTH - The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

SEVENTH - The private property of the members, trustees and officers of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatever.

EIGHTH - In the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding up of the corporation, whether voluntary, involuntary or by operation of law, except as may be provided by law the trustees of the corporation shall have the power to dispose of the total assets of the corporation in such manner as they, in the exercise of an absolute and uncontrolled discretion may by a majority vote determine; provided, however, that the corporation's property shall not be conveyed or distributed to any director, officer, employee or member of a committee of, or person connected with the corporation, or any other private individual, nor to any organization created or operated for profit; but, after deducting all necessary expenses of liquidation, dissolution or winding up, as the case may be, all the remaining property and assets of the

corporation shall be distributed to such other organizations as shall then qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws, as the trustees of the corporation shall in their discretion determine.

NINTH - The management of the affairs of the corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees. The number of trustees, the manner of their election, their tenure of office, the place, times and conduct of their meetings and their duties and powers shall, except as otherwise provided in this Certificate of Incorporation, be prescribed in the by-laws.

In furtherance and not in limitation of the powers conferred by law, the Board of Trustees is expressly authorized:

1 - To make, alter and amend any by-laws and to alter and repeal any by-laws so made by the Board of Trustees.

2 - To borrow money in the name of the corporation and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgages and liens without limit as to amount, upon real and personal property of the corporation.

3 - To appoint such committee or committees, including an Executive Committee of two or more members, as the Board of Trustees in their discretion shall deem desirable for the furtherance of the objects and purposes of the corporation, and to delegate to such committee or committees such powers as in the discretion of the Board of Trustees are necessary and desirable.

4 - In the exercise of an absolute and uncontrolled discretion, to make any and all donations, gifts, contributions and loans which the corporation may make pursuant to this certificate of incorporation, without responsibility or accountability to the members of this corporation for any such donations, gifts, contributions or loans in any respect whatever; subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the statutes of Delaware.

5 - In addition to the powers and authorities hereinbefore or by statute expressly conferred upon them, to exercise all such powers and do all such things as may be exercised or done by the corporation subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the statutes of Delaware, of this Certificate, and to the by-laws of the corporation.

6 - To the fullest extent that the General Corporation Law of the State of Delaware as it exists on the date hereof or as it may hereafter be amended permits the limitation or elimination of the liability of the trustees of the corporation, no such trustee shall be liable to the Corporation or its members for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as such a trustee. No amendment to or repeal of this Article shall apply to or have any effect on the liability or alleged liability of any such trustee for or with respect to any acts or omissions of such trustee occurring prior to such amendment or repeal.

The corporation may by its by-laws confer upon the trustees and officers powers and authorities additional to those expressly conferred upon them by law and by this Certificate.

TENTH - The corporation reserves the right to amend, change or repeal any provision contained in this Certificate in the manner set forth in its by-laws, consistent with the statutes of Delaware.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership

Those individuals who are the members of the Board of Trustees of the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation (the "Corporation") from time to time shall be the members of the Corporation, who shall have all powers and authority reserved to "members" under the Delaware General Corporation Law, as amended from time to time. No separate meetings of the members are required or necessary.

ARTICLE II - TRUSTEES

Section 1. Powers and Duties

The Board of Trustees shall manage and control the affairs and property of the Corporation. All corporate powers, except such as are otherwise provided for in the Certificate of Incorporation, these By-Laws, or the laws of the State of Delaware, shall be and hereby are vested in and shall be exercised by the Board. The Board shall have full power to adopt rules and regulations governing all actions which it takes, except as otherwise provided by the laws of the State of Delaware, and shall have full authority with respect to the distribution and payment of monies received by the Corporation from time to time; provided, however, that the fundamental and basic purposes and powers of the Corporation, and the limitations thereon, as expressed in the Certificate of Incorporation, shall not thereby be amended or changed. The Board may, except as otherwise provided by the laws of the State of Delaware, delegate to committees of its own number, or to officers of the Corporation, such powers as it may see fit.

Section 2. Number; Election; Term of Office

The number of Trustees shall be no fewer than three (3) and no more than seventeen (17). The number of Trustees may be changed by majority vote of the Trustees acting in their capacity as members, provided that no decrease in the number of Trustees may serve to diminish the term of any Trustee then in office. Trustees shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the Trustees acting in their capacity as members. Trustees' terms shall start at the Annual Meeting of their election or, if elected between Annual Meetings, at the Annual Meeting next following their election.

Trustees shall be elected to a term of five years and, in any event, each Trustee will continue in office until his or her successor has been elected and qualified, or until his or her earlier death, resignation, or removal. Each Trustee is subject to renomination and reelection at the end of each five-year term from which he or she may be eligible for reelection. In no event shall a Trustee initially elected after June 11, 1997 and prior to March 24, 2008 hold office for

more than three consecutive five-year terms. The normal retirement date for Trustees elected prior to June 11, 1997 is the Annual Meeting following their 72nd birthday; however, if they are in midterm at age 72, retirement will be extended to the end of their term. Trustees initially elected after March 24, 2008 may hold office for no more than three consecutive terms, or to the Annual Meeting following their 75th birthday, whichever comes sooner.

Section 3. Trustee ex officio

The President, upon his or her election as President, shall be a Trustee ex officio. As such, he or she shall have all the rights and responsibilities afforded to the office of Trustee, except that years served as Trustee ex officio shall be disregarded for the purpose of determining Trustee term limits as described in Section 2 of this Article.

Section 4. Quorum and Board Action

One-third of the total number of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting and, except as otherwise provided by law or these Bylaws, the act of a majority of the Trustees present at any meeting, at which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Board of Trustees.

Section 5. Place of Holding Meetings and Keeping Books

The Trustees may hold their meetings and keep the books of the Corporation outside of the State of Delaware, at any office or offices of the Corporation, or at any other place, as they may from time to time determine.

Section 6. Annual Meeting; Notice

Each newly elected Board of Trustees may hold its first meeting for the purpose of organization and the transaction of business, if a quorum be present, immediately after its election, or at such time and place as may be fixed by consent in writing of all the Trustees. Thereafter there shall be an Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees at such time and place as shall be determined by resolution of the Board.

Section 7. Regular Meetings; Notice

Regular meetings may be held without notice at such times and places as shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board.

Section 8. Special Meetings; Notice

The Chair, President or Secretary may, and at the request of a majority of the Board of Trustees shall, call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees, on at least five (5) days' notice to each member of the Board given in person, by telephone, by mail to his or her last known post office address, or by electronic transmission if the Trustee has consented to receipt of electronic notice.

Section 9. Meeting Chair

The Chair of the Board of Trustees shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board. In the absence of the Chair of the Board, the President, if present, shall preside. In the absence of both the Chair of the Board and the President, a member of the Board of Trustees selected by a majority of the Trustees present shall preside.

Section 10. Vacancies

Any vacancy in the Board of Trustees, whether arising from death, resignation, removal, an increase in the number of Trustees or any other cause, may be filled either by a majority vote of the remaining Trustees, though less than a quorum, or by the Trustees acting in their capacity as members.

Section 11. Resignation and Removal

Any Trustee may resign at any time by giving written notice of such resignation to the President or Secretary. Any Trustee may be removed without cause by a majority vote of the Trustees then in office.

Section 12. Participation by Telephone

The Corporation expects Trustees to attend meetings in person. However, any one or more members of the Board or of a committee thereof may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment allowing all persons participating in the meeting to hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means will constitute presence in person at the meeting.

Section 13. Action Without a Meeting

Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board or any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting, if all members of the Board or the committee consent in writing or by electronic transmission to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action. The resolution and the written or electronically transmitted consents by the members of the Board or of such committee will be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board or of such committee.

Section 14. Adjournment

At any meeting of the Board, whether or not a quorum is present, a majority of the Trustees present may adjourn the meeting to another time and place without further notice to any absent Trustees. At any such adjourned meeting at which a quorum is present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called.

Section 15. Compensation

Trustees may receive a stipend for their services as Trustees, provided that the stipend is reasonable in light of prevailing practices for comparable positions. The amount of the stipend will be determined from time to time by the Board of Trustees or such committee thereof as the Board may determine.

Section 16. Annual Financial Report

- (a) There shall be presented at the Annual Meeting of Trustees a report, verified by the President and the Vice President and Secretary or certified by an independent or certified public accountant firm selected by the Board, showing the following:
 - (1) the assets and liabilities, including any trust funds, of the Corporation as of the end of the previous 12 month fiscal year;
 - (2) the principal changes therein during such fiscal period;
 - (3) the revenues of the Corporation during such fiscal period;
 - (4) expenses and other disbursements of the Corporation during such fiscal period;
- (b) The Annual Financial Report shall be filed with the records of the Corporation.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

Section 1. Number and Manner of Election

The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chair of the Board, a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Treasurer and a Secretary, each to have such duties as are provided for in these By-Laws or as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine. Any person may hold two or more offices at the same time.

Such officers shall be elected annually at the first meeting of the Board of Trustees following the election of the Board, each to hold office until his or her successor shall have been duly elected and qualified, or until his or her earlier death, resignation or removal. Vacancies in any one or more of such offices may be filled by the Board of Trustees at any time.

The Board of Trustees may appoint such other officers or agents as it may from time to time determine necessary or desirable, each to hold office for such period and to perform such duties as the Board of Trustees may determine.

The Board shall annually conduct a performance assessment of the officers and shall approve any changes in compensation following this assessment.

Section 2. The Chair of the Board

The Chair of the Board shall be elected from among the Trustees. The Chair shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees, the Executive Committee, and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine.

Section 3. The President

The President shall be the chief executive officer and shall have general management and control over the business and affairs of the Corporation, subject to the direction of the Board of Trustees. The President serves as a member of the Board of Trustees, ex officio. In the absence of the Chair of the Board, the President, if present, shall preside at the meetings of the Board of Trustees. The President shall have the power to appoint and discharge the employees and agents, other than officers, of the Corporation and fix their compensation, and may make and sign contracts and agreements in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, and, in general, shall perform such other duties as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine. The President's performance and compensation will be annually reviewed by the Board.

Section 4. Vice Presidents

The Vice Presidents shall perform such duties as the Board of Trustees or the President may from time to time determine. The Vice Presidents may be delegated authority by the President to approve and sign contracts. In the event of absence or disability of the President, a Vice President selected in accordance with procedures established by the Board shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President.

Section 5. Treasurer

The Treasurer shall perform all the duties customary to that office, and shall have the care and custody of the funds and securities of the Corporation, and shall have the general supervision of the books of account, and shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his or her duties as the Board of Trustees may determine.

Section 6. Secretary

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Board of Trustees' meetings, and shall have the custody of the seal of the Corporation and affix the same to documents when authorized so to do. The Secretary shall coordinate Board orientation and ongoing Board education. He or she shall perform all of the other duties usual to that office.

Section 7. Resignation and Removal

Any officer may resign at any time by delivering a written resignation to the President or Secretary of the Corporation. The acceptance of any such resignation, unless required by the terms thereof, will not be necessary to make the same effective. Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Trustees or any member of any committee, may be removed at any time without cause by the majority vote of the Trustees at a meeting of the Board called for that purpose.

Section 8. Compensation

Officers may receive compensation for their services as such, provided the compensation is reasonable in light of prevailing practices for comparable positions. The amount of the compensation will be determined from time to time by the Board of Trustees or such committee thereof as the Board may determine. Officers' compensation will be annually reviewed by the Board.

ARTICLE IV - COMMITTEES

Section 1. Standing Committees

The standing committees of the Board of Trustees shall be the Executive Committee, Audit Committee, Investment Committee, and such other committees as the Board may designate by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board. Each committee shall consist of three (3) or more Trustees, except that the Investment Committee may contain members that are not Trustees, provided that the number of Trustees on the Investment Committee shall always constitute a majority of the Committee's members. Standing committee members shall be appointed by the Chair of the Board.

Standing committees, to the extent provided in the Board resolution authorizing their establishment and not restricted by law, will have and exercise the authority to act on behalf of the Board in the management of the Corporation; provided, however, that no such committee will have power to (i) amend the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation, (ii) adopt an agreement of merger or consolidation, or (iii) amend the Corporation's By-Laws. Notwithstanding the provisions of any charter or rules of procedure, the activities of each committee shall be reflected in minutes maintained by the committee chair or his or her designee.

Section 2. Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair of the Board, the President, and such other Trustees as are designated by the Board, except that there shall at all times be at least three (3) Trustees on the Committee. The Committee shall have and may exercise all of the powers and authority of the Board, except those duties delegated to other standing committees or prohibited by law. The Committee shall review and make recommendations to the Board concerning the election of Trustees and matters of Board policies and procedures, including compensation and governance. The Committee shall also perform such tasks as are from time to time assigned to it by the Board. The Committee shall notify the full Board of its actions within a reasonable time thereafter at a Board meeting. The Chair of the Committee shall be the Chair of the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Audit Committee

The Audit Committee shall consist of at least three (3) Trustees, none of whom may be a paid employee or consultant of the Corporation and each of whom shall have a familiarity with finance and accounting practices. Neither the Chair nor the President may be a member of the Committee, but both may attend any Committee meeting. The Committee shall review the annual audit of the Corporation and recommend to the Board the hiring and termination of the Corporation's outside auditors and the establishment of the terms of the outside auditor's engagement. The Committee shall be responsible for reviewing and commenting on the adequacy of the Corporation's financial disclosure and internal controls. The Committee shall meet at least twice annually and shall present reports to the Executive Committee and the Board on the above matters.

Section 4. Investment Committee

The Investment Committee shall consist of at least three (3) Trustees and may also contain persons who are not Trustees, so long as a majority of the Committee members are Trustees. The Investment Committee shall be responsible for overseeing the investment and reinvestment of the Corporation's assets and setting investment policies and guidelines regarding those assets. The Committee may (a) delegate to committees, officers, employees or agents, including investment advisors, counsel or managers, the authority to act in its place in the investment and reinvestment of assets; (b) contract with investment advisors, counsel or managers to so act; and (c) authorize the payment of compensation for investment advisory, counseling or management services. The Committee shall present periodic reports to the Board regarding the performance of the Corporation's investments. The Investment Committee shall have such other powers and duties as are determined by the Board of Trustees.

Section 5. Advisory Committees

The Board of Trustees may create, and appoint the members of, other committees not having and exercising the authority of the Board as may be deemed desirable to advise management and the Board. Each advisory committee shall exercise such powers and perform such specific duties as may be prescribed by the Board. The designation and appointment of any such committee and delegation thereto of authority will not operate to relieve the Board of Trustees, or any individual Trustee, of any responsibility imposed upon it, him or her by law.

Section 6. Quorum and Committee Action

Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Trustees designating a committee, a majority of the entire committee will constitute a quorum. The act of a majority of the committee members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present will be the act of the committee.

Section 7. Replacement

In the absence or disqualification of a member of a committee, the committee member or members thereof present at any meeting and not disqualified from voting, whether or not constituting a quorum, may unanimously appoint another Trustee to act at the meeting in the place of any such absent or disqualified member.

Section 8. Chair

Except for those committees to which a chair is assigned by these By-Laws, a chair shall be appointed by the Chair of the Board.

Section 9. Rules

Each committee may adopt rules for its own governance not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

ARTICLE V - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 1. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall end on the 31st day of December of each

year.

Section 2. Waiver of Notice

Whenever notice is required to be given under any provision of law or of the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, a written waiver thereof, signed by the person entitled to notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to notice. Attendance of a person at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except for the express purpose of objecting, or as otherwise provided by law.

Section 3. Indemnification

Except as otherwise required by law,

the Corporation shall, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law as then in (a) effect, indemnify any person who was or is involved in any manner (including, without limitation, as a party or a witness) or who is threatened to be made so involved in any threatened, pending or completed claim, action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (including, without limitation, any action, suit or proceeding by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor (a "derivative suit")) by reason of the fact that he or she, his or her testator or intestate, is or was a trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise (including, without limitation, any employee benefit plan) against all expenses (including attorney's fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, subject to the proviso that in the case of a derivative suit any payment made pursuant to a court judgment must be authorized by the

court). Such indemnification shall be a contract right and shall include the right to receive payment in advance of any expense incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit or proceeding, consistent with the provisions of applicable law as then in effect;

- (b) the termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful:
- (c) any indemnification under subparagraph (a) of this Section shall be made by the Corporation only as authorized in the specific case upon a determination that indemnification of the director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent is proper under the circumstances because he has met the applicable law as then in effect. Such determination shall be made (1) by the Board of Trustees by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Trustees who were not parties to such action, suit or proceeding, or (2) if such a quorum is not obtainable, by the Board of Trustees in accordance with such determination by independent legal counsel selected by the Board. To the extent that any such person has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in subparagraph (a) or in defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, he or she shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys fees) actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection therewith;
- (d) expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding shall be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit or proceeding, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent to repay such amount if shall ultimately be determined that he is not entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation as authorized by this Section;
- (e) the foregoing right of indemnification and the advancement of expenses shall not be deemed exclusive of any rights to which any such director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent may be entitled by contract or otherwise or of any power of the Corporation with respect to other rights, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be such a director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person. The provisions of this Section shall be separable and if any of its provisions shall be adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof; and
- (f) the Corporation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the

Corporation as a director, trustee, officer, committee member, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of such person's status as such.

Section 4. Banks

The Board will from time to time and as necessary select such banks or depositaries as it will deem proper for the funds of the Corporation. The Treasurer, and any other person authorized by the Board from time to time, may sign checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money on the Corporation's behalf.

Section 5. Contracts and Other Instruments

Except as otherwise provided by these By-Laws or authorized by the Board, no Trustee, officer, committee member, employee, agent, or other person will have power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract, agreement, or instrument or to render it liable for any purpose or for any amount. The Board may authorize any officer or officers, in the name of or on behalf of the Corporation, to enter into any contract or to execute and to deliver any instrument, or to sign checks, drafts, endorsements, notes or other evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. The withdrawal of funds or securities of the Corporation from banks or trust companies or vaults therein will be made only on the signature or signatures of such one or more of the Trustees, officers, or employees of the Corporation as may be designated from time to time by the Board for such purpose.

Section 6. Loans

The Corporation may not borrow or loan funds or assets and may not issue negotiable paper unless authorized by the vote of the Board. When so authorized by the Board, any officer of the Corporation may effect loans and advances at any time for the Corporation from any bank, trust company or other institution, or from any firm, Corporation, or individual. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. No loans other than through the purchase of bonds, debentures or similar obligations of the type customarily sold in public offerings, or through ordinary deposit of funds in a bank, will be made by the Corporation to its Trustees or officers, or to any other corporation, firm, association or other entity in which one or more of its Trustees or officers are trustees or officers or hold a substantial interest, except a loan to an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 7. Grants

Procedures for approving grants, including delegation of authority to approve grants, will be set forth by the Board from time to time.

ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees, by a majority vote of the entire Board then in office.
